



We provide the following services to individuals 16 years of age and older:

- Individual assessment and psychotherapy
- Therapy in various locations
 - o St. Catharines, Niagara Falls, Fort Erie, Port **Colborne and Welland**
- Group counselling
- Family member support and education
- Anonymous Third Party Reporting
- Professional consultation and training

The intention of counselling is to:

- · Address the impact of sexual violence
- Manage trauma symptoms related to sexual trauma (e.g. depression, anxiety, flashbacks, nightmares, dissociation, sleep disturbances, selfharm behaviours, body image concerns, relationship issues)
- · Develop and increase confidence and self-trust

All services are:

- Provided by professionally-trained therapists specializing in trauma therapy
- Confidential and free
- · Self-referrals are required. Simply call 905-682-7258 for more information.

Hospital Response



If you were sexually assaulted within the past 12 days, you can go to the St. Catharines General Hospital and ask to speak to the SADV Unit. Remember you have choices and you can decide what happens to you.

You will be offered the following choices at the sexual assault treatment centre:

- Medical treatment
- Collection of physical evidence
 - This evidence can be held for up to 1 year while you decide if you would like to press charges
- Legal options
- Follow-up care and referrals
 - Counselling services or community supports

A hospital-response worker from our centre will be called by the hospital to provide support and advocacy for you and any family members or friends in attendance.
